Eligibility:

Awarded to a full time Indigenous student studying on the Vancouver campus who identifies they are from either the səfilwətaʔt təməxʷ (Tseil-Waututh), šxʷməθkʷəyəməʔt təməxʷ (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh-ulh Temíxw (Squamish), Hul'qumi'num, Tsawwassen, Ləkʷəŋən, or Stó:lō territories. Students must also speak to their connection to their community. If no applicant from any of the listed areas applies, then applicants from the next closest band/nation geographically will be considered. Students must also speak to their connection to their community.

Value:

Two (2) \$2,500.00 awards to be presented to a full-time Indigenous student from one of the above nations (non-status/self-identifying included). If there is no applicant from any of the listed nations, then the award is presented to the first suitable applicant from the next closest nation geographically.

Value:

Two (2) \$2,500.00 award to be presented to a full-time Indigenous student from one of the above nations (non-status/self-identifying included).

Process:

Students must complete the following application checklist:

- Complete and sign the application form.
- Complete a 300-500 word essay on their connection to their community.

Deadline:

The NVIT Registration Office must receive applications by 4:30pm on March 15, 2023. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. Please drop off or email awards package. Students may appeal the award decision by submitting a written letter to the awards adjudication committee attention:
