

School District #36 – NVIT Community and Public Safety Professional Program Bursary 2024 Application

Purpose:

The School District No. 36 (Surrey) and Nicola Valley Institute of Technology (NVIT) jointly agree to enter into a partnership for the selection of students and delivery of the Criminal Justice Studies I (CAPS 140) course of the Nicola Valley Institute of Technology's Community and Public Safety Professional Program. This course will lead to a post-secondary course credit awarded by Nicola Valley Institute of Technology, as well as, credit toward secondary school graduation requirements.

The Criminal Justice Studies I (CAPS 140) course of the Community and Public Safety Professional Program will provide selected students in their Grade 12 year who show an aptitude and interest in law enforcement preparation, the opportunity to concurrently enrol in a Nicola Valley Institute of Technology Community and Public Safety Professional certificate course.

Eligibility:

Awarded to graduating students from School District #36 who successfully complete CAPS 140, Criminal Justice Studies I. Students must demonstrate positive attitudes, leadership, community service and good academic achievement, as well as, display evidence of active participation in school activities. Students will show an interest in enrolling into NVIT's Community and Public Safety Professional program.

Criteria:

Applicants for the NVIT Community and Public Safety Program (CAPS) Bursary will have a demonstrated career interest in the public safety sector and will meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be going on to study at NVIT's Community and Public Safety Program;
- Applicants **must** have participated in the Career Education District NVIT CAPS Partnership Program and successfully completed the Criminal Justice Studies I (CAPS 140 Course); and
- Applicants must demonstrate positive attitude, leadership and community service and good academic achievement as well as evidence of the active participation in school activities.

Applicants are required to submit the following:

- A completed application form;
- An official transcript of grades;
- A 100-word typed statement indicating future career plans and the proposed use of the bursary; and
- A reference letter from a Career Education teacher.

Value:

NVIT will donate one (1) award of \$283.92 (the tuition cost of one three-credit course) at the annual NVIT awards ceremony held in September each year. Please note, students will still be responsible to pay all mandatory fees.

Deadline:

The deadline to submit the application for the School District #36 NVIT Community and Public Safety Professional Bursary to the Career Education District Office is 4:30pm, March 15, 2024. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted. Students may appeal the award decision by submitting a written letter to the awards adjudication committee attention:
