

# Arresting Hope Education Award

## Purpose of Award:

The idea for education awards started during a participatory health research project inside a BC provincial correctional centre for women. During the research project, incarcerated women gave voice to their goals for improving health, including their goal to engage in meaningful education. One incarcerated woman said, "They should sentence us to education!" In 2008, women released into the community formed a network comprised of formerly incarcerated women and their families, and volunteers and academics, with the aim of furthering the emotional, physical, mental and spiritual healing of women inside and outside prison through participatory research processes.

An education fund was created to provide financial support to empower women's education and that of their children. The Women's Health Research Institute and BC Women's Hospital, initially hosted the education fund until 2017 when the Arresting Hope Education Fund was created with the Vancouver Foundation.

In addition, net proceeds from book sales of 'Arresting Hope' (Inanna, 2014 <http://www.inanna.ca/catalog/arresting-hope-women-taking-action-prison-health-inside-out/>), are being donated to the Arresting Hope Education Fund. An awards adjudication committee, hosted at the Nicola Valley Institute of Technology, British Columbia's Aboriginal public post-secondary institute, administers the education awards. The committee members have many years of experience in community service, corrections and education and donate their time and expertise to the committee process.

## Eligibility:

The Arresting Hope Education Award recognizes women living in British Columbia and attending a post-secondary institution in BC, full- or part-time, who are currently incarcerated or have previous incarceration experience. Their children, up to the age of 25 years, are also eligible to apply for this award. The applicant must be registered in a post-secondary institution in BC. The applicant must demonstrate passion and motivation to learn, a commitment and responsibility toward their studies, and strong positive personal attributes. The applicant must also demonstrate financial need.

## Criteria:

Applicants must complete the following application process.

- submit proof of incarceration or child of an incarcerated mother (any documentation or a narrative can be provided);
- submit proof of age (a copy of one picture ID)
- complete and sign the application form;
- submit a copy of the registration statement;
- complete the personal commitment form;
- submit a copy of the program layout, course listing or degree audit; and
- submit, in a sealed envelope, a character reference letter, written by a community member, that describes the applicant's consistent commitment and responsibility toward their educational studies and positive personal attributes.

## Amount:

The awards adjudication committee reserves the right to specify the award value, but it will typically be \$250. The applicant will provide a registration statement, by August 15<sup>th</sup> at 4:30pm, to the Awards Adjudication committee, which then the Vancouver Foundation will transfer the award money to the education institution to be applied to the student's account to cover tuition and/or fees.

## Deadline:

The deadline to submit the application for the Arresting Hope Education Award is 4:30pm, April 30<sup>th</sup> each year. If April 30<sup>th</sup> lands on a weekend, the package is due at 4:30pm, the last business day before the due date. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
