Native Northwest Reconciliation Entrance Bursary 2025



Purpose:

Native Northwest is a company that supports Indigenous Arts and Culture in Canada. They are Indigenous-focused and publish children's books, artwork and other items that promote Indigeneity. Native Northwest's story began over 38 years ago with a social worker, a rack of postcards, and the vision of building everyday connection to Indigenous cultures. The values behind the Native Northwest brand originate with the founding reason for the company: Native arts and cultures, designed by Indigenous artists, built on a foundation of respect and authenticity. We tie authentic designs to bold, new concepts where artists can tell the stories of their communities and cultures through their distinct designs. Native Northwest operates on Musqueam, Coast Salish territory in Vancouver, British Columbia.

Amount:

Two (2) bursaries of \$500 each, will be provided by Native Northwest to support Indigenous learners in their studies.

Eligibility Criteria:

This bursary is open to self-identified Indigenous learners from any campus (community programs included) who are enrolled in a minimum 60% course load for the for the upcoming academic year. This entrance bursary is open to learners enrolled in any field of study (Developmental Education, Employment Skills Access, Bridging to Trades and Micro-credentials are excluded). The bursary application, proof of enrolment (via transcripts or a registration statement) and a 300-word essay describing dedication to Indigenous arts and/or culture are required to be eligible for this award.
