

Mercer Scholarship 2025-2026 Application

Purpose:

Eligibility:

To be eligible, students must be registered in a business program (OFAD1, OFAD2, AGLP1, FNPA1, TMGT1, ACED1, ACED2, IBUS2) and want to pursue a career in leadership and/or human resource management. Students must have the ability to demonstrate the following values during the academic year: passion, respect for diversity, integrity, innovation, dedication, empowerment and accountability. Students must also achieve a minimum grade point average of 3.0.

Amount:

Two (2) awards of \$500 each will be disbursed at the annual NVIT graduation ceremony. If the recipient is not graduating this year, they will be notified by email and can redeem the award by contacting awards@nvit.ca.

Criteria:

Student will submit the following items:

- Complete and sign the application form.
- Submit an essay (500-word minimum) what is your ability to demonstrate the following values during the academic year:
 - Passion to be the best – this is not necessarily the person who gets the best grade but one who strives for excellence.
 - Respect for diversity – being inclusive; listening to and collaborating with other.
 - Integrity – knowing what's right and acting responsibly.
 - Innovation – thinking outside the box and presenting creative solutions to assignments.
 - Dedication – to quality and success.
 - Empowered and accountable – for the work they do and the actions they take.
- Provide proof of achieving a minimum 3.0 grade point average by submitting an NVIT transcript.

Deadline:

The NVIT Registration Office must receive applications by 4:30pm on March 31, 2026. If March 31st lands on a weekend, the application will be due the last business day before the deadline. Please email a copy to awards@nvit.ca or drop off the original copy at the front desk of either campus; faxes and/or photocopies will not be accepted. Reference letters must also be submitted through email to awards@nvit.ca.
